Livestock Health Regulations

- Entry of honeybees
 - Free from tracheal mite, *Varroa* mite, greater wax moth and small hive beetle
- Aleutian Disease in Mink – control
- Specific Pathogen Disease-Free Swine

What We Know Of “keeping an eye out for”

Purple Loosestrife

- Goobies, Deer Lake

Barnyard grass

- Northern Peninsula

Convergent Lady Bug (greenhouse)

- Through out Province - not proven to over winter

Sap Beetle

- Western NL on corn and grain

CONCERNS

- Blueberry Maggot
 - Colorado Potato Beetle
 - Swede Midge
 - Sudden Oak Death
- All of the above would have a financial impact on the agrifoods sector
